

The rather limited area, the permanent 'farmers market' shed which houses the vendors, the inclement weather, and the enthusiasm of the hardworking volunteer workers give this game a feel of what such a gathering in the 'auld' country could have been.



The host motel, Days Inn, of Forsyth was a pleasant surprise at a room rate of \$39 per night and from the motel we rode a shuttle bus to the Sponsor's Reception held on Friday evening in a small former church building near the festival grounds. Dress requirements for this affair were scant, and next year we know to go in full Scottish attire. The delicious bar-be-que was 'sliced while you wait'.

Saturday, April 8, dawned cloudy, but as Scots are not supposed to mind a bit of mist, we arrived at the games site to set up the tent. The weather became more and more disagreeable with rain, gusty wind, and very few dry moments throughout the entire day. Among the tent visitors helping us endure the 'wetness' was Claude Hicks, Jr., a federal judge in Macon. Later in the summer at the Grandfather Mountain Games we were happy to meet his wife, Lynn, as well. We also had the pleasure of meeting John and Marsha Nuttall of Marietta. Both couples are interested in the gathering of MacLeans / MacLaines on Mull Island in 2002.

Neil Anderson and Full Circle, Smithfield Fair and Eric Duncan provided all day entertainment for festival attendees. It was also nice to see Kay Cummings of

Sunday morning was beautiful, and a simple, inspiring Kirkin' service was held in the nearby Methodist Church (built in 1802). Several more stones from Scotland were presented to be included in the memorial cairn. A special thanks to Tom Gillon of Macon and his friend for their help.

Carrollton, KY: on May 12-14 the 2000 Highland Games were held at General Butler State Park for the 18th year. Alex Beaton and Seven Nations were the featured performers. A full weekend of games activities--golf tournament, sponsors' reception and a concert by Seven Nations on Friday, regular events all day Saturday with a Ceilidh that evening, and then Sunday a Kirkin' Service.

Very early Saturday morning brought rain to the area, but it stopped in time for clan tent sponsors to unload, and the remainder of the weekend, though a bit damp, was very pleasant. All 23 clan tent tables were housed under one huge tent on a paved surface (quite a contrast withthe ankle deep mud we endured the month before at Loch Norman!). This tent arrangement encouraged more talk, interest and interaction among clans than is usually evident. Booth spots were not assigned, and MacLeans found themselves beside MacLeods and MacEwens, and close to MacArthurs and MacKays.

Our clan MacLean table was busy, our framed Scotland map continued to draw interest. 14 people signed our visitor's log. It was good to renew our friendship with Dean McClain of Louisville, KY, and we were delighted when he accepted the convenership for the state of Kentucky.

Glasgow Higland Games (KY): the Clan Gillean USA tent (MacLeans and MacLaines) was a beehive of activity at the Barren Lake State Park site of the Games, June 2-4, 2000. As sponsors of the tent, Clarence and Bobbye Greek were ably assisted by Jim and Kathy Waddell of Knoxville, TN, Dean and Susan McClain of Louisville, KY, and Claude Hicks of Macon, GA. They were joined on Sunday by Dean's sister, Sharla McClain of Frankfort, KY.

All this group took turns at the "front" table, meeting and greeting passers-by and helping all of them find "their" homeplace on the big framed map of Scotland.

Just around the corner from the Clan Gillean tent, Charlie and Tricia McVey of Nashville, TN, were very busy with several Scotties (black) and a couple of Westies (white). They provide a rescue service in Middle Tennessee and Southern Kentucky for Scottish breeds who are abandoned, abused or left at the Nashville Animal Control Facility or other area shelters. Their tent attracts a large number of interested game attendees.

As usual the Glasgow Games provided all the expected sights, sounds and smells (of delicious British food) that we all hope to find at these Highland Games. The KY weather was beautiful both days which added to our enjoyment. We were also introduced to a new composition by William Jackson -- a very patriotic song celebrating Scotland as the "Land of Light".

Imagine our pleasure when Sunday afternoon brought the Lessenberry family of Glasgow to our tent. Mrs. Lessenberry is a MacLean. Her grandmother's first name was MacLean and that name has always been given to a daughter of the Lessenberry family. Four years old, MacLean Lessenberry signed our visitor's list and went home with a new Duart castle t-shirt "just her size".

Please remember than in less than 2 months this game will be the site of the International Games at which time most clans represented in the USA will be present along with the Chiefs of perhaps a dozen clans.

Jonesborough, TN: the one-day Celtic Festival here on June 10, 2000, brought a good crowd to the business district of this small, historic East Tennessee town. Founded in 1779, Jonesborough is the oldest town in the state. Main Street has a 19th-century atmosphere, with many restored buildings, brick sidewalks and street lights that resemble gas-lights. This Festival leans towards a country fair occasion with period costumes.

Jim and Kathy Waddell were tent sponsors of the MacLeans and did a good job locating the tent under a tree to take advantage of the shade. Our State Convenor, Earl Fletcher, with good help from Stony Lane (Clan PResident Kirk Lane's son), erected a tent and we were set for the day. Earl is active in the 79th Cameron Highlanders Regiment, which added color and flair on the walk-abouts of pipes and drums. Nine people signed the MacLean's visitor's log--one even taking along applications for 5 more family members!

Dew Market, AL: Clan Maxwell was honored on June 16-18 at the North Alabama Highland Festival and Games held at Sharon Johnston Park. The history of Clan Maxwell and its participation as one of the "Border Reivers" was emphasized throughout the Festival. This site borders a small lake with tall pines nearby and provides a small covered stage for performers. The area is small and lends itself to a close, family atmosphere. There were 24 clans represented as well as a variety of merchandise and food vendors. Over 500 people attended on Saturday.

Clan tents were set up on Saturday with many glances skyward as the weather was threatening. Rain held off till noon, but after that it was shower, sun, shower, sun, so many folded their tents and stole away to dryer quarters. MacLean flags, tablecovers, signs, etc., were more than damp, a condition which prevented us from setting up on Sunday. Nine visitors to our tent signed our guest list, and membership papers were given to several of these visitors with the hope that they will join our clan.


