

#### MUSIC AND THE MACLEANS

#### **Claude Hicks FSA Scot**

Not all Macleans/Maclaines can be considered heroes or even upright citizens for that matter. Some have gained legendary status through less than honorable behavior. Such is the case of "The Wild McLeans" of Canadian folklore about which a song was written and recorded by Canadian singer/songwriter Ian Tyson.

In December of 1879, "The Wild McLeans," consisting of brothers Allan, Charles and Archie and their friend Alex Hare, went on a drunken rampage of thievery and terror among the populous of British Columbia, culminating in the gunning down of police constable Johnny Ussher and a settler who refused to give them food. Ussher had formed a posse to arrest the boys who had stolen a prize stallion owned by William Palmer. The McLeans were sons of Donald McLean, a reputable trader, who had died some fourteen years earlier. After Ussher's death in the gun battle with the McLeans, the boys were cornered and captured by the authorities, brought to trial, and convicted. Because of a technicality, a second trial was required, but the results were the same. On January 31, 1881, all four were hanged. Allan and Charles were in their mid-twenties; Alex Hare was seventeen; and, Archie McLean was only fifteen, earning him the dubious distinction of being the youngest person ever executed in British Columbia.

As a footnote, George McLean, a son of one of "The Wild McLeans," distinguished himself in World War I in 1917 for an extraordinary feat of valor at the Battle of Vimy where he killed nineteen Germans and captured fourteen. Ian Tyson's ballad appears on the 1964 Vanguard recording *Northern Journey* by Ian and Sylvia and is entitled *Four Rode By*.

Willie Palmer's stallion was no twenty dollar cayuse
And when the wild ones stole him he hightailed it into town
Ussher in those days was keeping order in the district
But before he'd ridden thirty miles the McLean boys shot him down

They were armed, all were armed
It was them I'd have known them anywhere

A shepherd known as Kelly saw the wild bunch as they passed
They shot him with a rifle and took his watch and chain
