The Story of Sir Billy Connolly's Kilt

Howie Nicholsby owns 21st Century Kilts in Edinburgh's Thistle Street. This year he had a very special commission – to make an outfit for Sir Billy Connolly to wear as Grand Marshal of the New York City Tartan Day Parade.

This is an event which Howie knows all about. The screensaver on his computer, visible to all who come into his shop, shows him, his wife Charlie and their two young boys leading the parade down Sixth Avenue in 2014.

Connolly's kilt outfit with matching tartan waistcoat and jacket stunned the crowd lining Sixth Avenue on Saturday. He was dressed top to tail in Weathered Maclean of Duart, his family tartan. There was an air of traditionality with a shoulder plaid which Howie's mum and dad made.

Howie's own kilts are very distinctive with pockets rather than a sporran, often with pockets lined in the same fabric as the inside of the matching jacket. The attention to detail is intense, but as a shoulder plaid is not really his style he was happy to hand that part of the outfit over to his parents. Howie claims it is always possible to have any styles mixed together.

And the kilt entrepreneur was delighted with the way the outfit turned out. He proclaimed: "If there was ever to be a King of Scotland, this is what I hope he would wear. It's regal, fun, elegant and proud. When you are wearing a full tartan outfit (and yes I suppose it is a bit similar to the one I made for Alan Cumming who led the parade a few years ago – it is very timeless.

"To have Billy Connolly as Grand Marshal this year is an absolute dream."

Honoring the Fallen on Culloden Moor

On the 273rd anniversary of the Battle of Culloden, Peter MacLean Docherty, who is of the Boreray branch of the Ardgour family, laid the Clan MacLean wreath in memory of our clansmen and those who fought and died on 16 April 1746.

The Battle of Culloden, where Jacobite supporters, seeking to restore the Stuart monarchy to the British throne, gathered to fight the Duke of Cumberland's government troops, was the last pitched battle on British soil and, in less than an hour, around 1,600 men were slain – 1,500 of them Jacobites.

According to various sources, there were 290 in the regiment which combined the MacLachlans and MacLeans under Chief Lachlan MacLachlan, Aid de Camp to the Bonnie Prince (Charles Stuart), with Charles MacLean of Drimnin second-in-command. The MacLachlan/MacLean Regiment was center line and saw the most brutal hand to hand combat and suffered heavy losses.

The exact number of MacLeans that made up the regiment is unknown but estimates are from 180-250 clansmen.

Clan MacLean was comprised of many from Drimnin, Ardgour and Torloisk. MacLean of Duart had a force of 500 men on the move but it is not sure how many, if any, were able to join the battle. We do know that 38 MacLeans returned from the battle and Charles MacLean of Drimnin and his two sons died on the battlefield.

In June of 2012, Sir Lachlan, Bt, CVO, DL, 28th Chief, addressed the Clan Congress on Mull, explaining that for the last century, the Chief's family had personally funded the upkeep and repairs that Duart Castle required, but the family could no longer afford the repairs on its own.
