A small inventory of items has been custom made and curated, ready to mail to you. All you need to do is identify an event near you that is not already represented by Clan MacLean. Contact our Lead Convener, Mary Sue Norman Wyatt. She will put you on the calendar and mail the kit to you before the game. You contact the games and register to convene. Upon completing the event, mail the kit back to Mary Sue. We will reimburse you the cost of registration and the cost of mailing the kit back to us. How easy is that?

In the kit we have Tartan flag, table runner, and parade banner. We have laminated copies of various tartans, historic weapons, and a Sept list. Make sure to have the Sept list front and center for all to see. If someone finds their name, welcome them as family. We have a vinyl banner with talking points about Clan Maclean to hang on the side of



your tent. We also have included a reference book, Tartan For Me. It is a listing of names and what clan or district family that name may be associated with. Scottish Naming Convention Reveals Family History – Part 2

In part one of this article I set the stage for how the traditional Scottish naming convention for naming children helped me identify some early family members and learn the given name of my 6x great grandmother, previously known only as a daughter of "the widow Dunlap". Here I discuss how application of the naming convention did that by looking at the given names of the grandchildren of her two known sons, Charles and Ephraim. In part three of this article I will discuss how the naming convention allowed me to confirm the identity of two of her daughters, previously unknown to my family.

We don't know from any direct evidence the namesakes of most of the 24 children of John's four known children, the first full generation of the family to be born in America. However, because his children and their children generally adhered to the naming convention, and with some other evidence and reasonable inferences to be drawn therefrom, we can draw some conclusions and determine possibilities.

Both Charles and Ephraim named their first sons after the boys' grandfather, John McLean. Both departed from the naming convention in naming their second sons Ephraim, after Ephraim Moore, their mother's step-father who helped raise them after their parents died. (The maternal grandfather of one boy was William Howard, the maternal grandfather of the other was John Davidson.) Obviously, Ephraim and Elizabeth Davidson McLean

also didn't want to give their second son the same name as their first, but when the first son was killed by Indians in 1781 they named their next born son John Davidson McLean. Ephraim and Elizabeth also departed from the naming convention in naming their first daughter Margaret (the maternal grandmother was Jane), no doubt in memory of his mother who died when he was young, but they then named their second daughter Jane. Charles named his only known daughter Rebecca. To date I haven't been able to determine the name of her maternal grandmother. It may have been Rebecca.

The following shows the names of Charles and Ephraim's children and their namesakes:

Name Namesake

Charles & Susannah Howard McLean (m. 1760/1761):

John (1761) His paternal grandfather, John McLean. Rebecca (c. 1764) Her (unknown) maternal grandmother?

Ephraim, Rev. (1768) His father's maternal step grandfather, Ephraim Moore.

Ephraim & Elizabeth Davidson McLean (m. 1761): *

John (1761; d. 1780/1781) His paternal grandfather, John McLean.

Margaret (1763) Her paternal grandmother, Margaret Dunlap McLean. Ephraim (1766) His father's maternal step grandfather, Ephraim Moore. **

George (1767) Elizabeth's brother? King George, III?***
Jane (1769) Her maternal grandmother, Jane Davidson.

Charles (1771) Ephraim's brother?

William (1773) William Dunlap, Ephraim's maternal uncle & guardian? Elizabeth's

brother? William McLean, Ephraim's uncle in Antrim?

Samuel (1775) Elizabeth's brother, twin of William?

James (1777) Elizabeth's brother, Maj. James Davidson?

James McLean, Ephraim's uncle in Antrim?

Alney (1779) ?

John Davidson (1781) John Davidson, Elizabeth's father.

Robert Davidson (1783) Elizabeth's uncle?

- * The children's names and years of birth are given as they are listed in the Ephraim McLean family bible, a reliable source for the children, their names and their birth sequence.
- ** If named for his father he probably would appear as "Ephraim, Jr." in the family bible. If named for his maternal uncle, Ephraim Davidson, he would have had the middle name of Davidson, as did his younger brothers, John and Robert.
- *** In 1767 Charles and Ephraim, active in the colonial government of North Carolina, had not yet made the transition from loyalty to the crown to Whig sentiments and Independence.

The Caber Toss

The Caber made from a long tree trunk that has been trimmed down so one end is slightly wider than the other. The caber is stood up for the thrower with the large end up. The thrower takes a short run with the caber holding it upright, then stops to push the caber so that the large end hits the ground and the small end flips over and faces away from the thrower. The goal is for the caber to land at 12:00 (like on a clock face)

You can try this at home with pool noodles for a safer and easier version!

The Haggis Hurl

The haggis hurl is when Haggis is thrown while standing on top of a whiskey barrel. Should the haggis burst upon hitting the ground it is immediately disqualified, because the haggis must be ready to eat after landing.

Try this with some ground meat or old meatloaf stuffed inside a rubber gloves tied off at the end. (outside of course!

Scottish Tablet Recipe

BAD FOR YOUR TEETH, BUT YUMMY!

INGREDIENTS:

4 OZ BUTTER

2LB OF SUGAR

1 CUP OF MILK

1 TIN CONDENSED MILK

ADDITIONAL:

1 SAUCER OF COLD WATER

1 WELL-GREASED TIN



DIRECTIONS:

PUT BUTTER, SUGAR AND CUP OF MILK INTO A SAUCE PAN. SLOWLY BRING TO A BOIL UNTIL SUGAR IS MELTED. BOIL FOR APPROX 10 MINUTES STIRRING CONTINUOUSLY.

REMOVE FROM HEAT AND ADD THE TIN OF CONDENSED MILK. SLOWLY BRING BACK TO A BOIL UNTIL IT BUBBLES. BOIL FOR APPROX 20 MINUTES. TEST A DROP IN THE SAUGER OF WATER UNTIL LIT FEELS LIKE A A SOFT BALL.

REMOVE FROM HEAT - ADD A BIT OF BUTTER AND BEAT FOR A FEW MINUTES. POUR INTO THE WELL-GREASED TIN. LEAVE TO COOL.

NOTE: YOU MAY HAVE TO REDUCE THE HEAT UNDER THE PAN WHILE BOILING AT BOTH STAGES TO PREVENT THE TABLET BURNING.
